MAJORING ON MAJORS

What is the greatest crisis of our generation in the Church of England? You may think the answer is obvious, because the proposals concerning propagating the 'Prayers of Love and Faith' has preoccupied nearly every meeting and conversations for me over the past few months. As we await the outcome of further synodical deliberations and episcopal manoeuvrings, the uncertainties and frustrations have been exhausting and unsettling to us all. In the midst of it, God has been doing some amazing things – bringing together a growing coalition of evangelical streams with others, determined to uphold the traditional biblical understanding of marriage and sexual intimacy. It is a pressing immediate priority to stand together, pray together and act together to resist any move away from the biblical norms that have undergirded our Anglican identity for generations. Please continue to do that! But that is not our greatest and most pressing crisis!

In John 4:27-28, the disciples knew that their current crisis was to find food and drink for Jesus, who was too tired to follow them to the village to get those resources. And when they returned they didn't..

pass comment that Jesus had needed to enlist the help of a Samaritan woman to get himself water (v.27), but they were surprised that he didn't seem bothered about their food crisis (v.31-33) and assumed someone else had fed him first. Instead, Jesus challenged them to open their eyes more widely than their immediate crisis, to what He sees as more urgent and important than even his own sustenance. "My food... is to do the will of him who sent me and to finish his work. ...open your eyes and look at the fields! They are ripe for harvest" (v.34).

As food is given to sustain our physical bodies, Jesus is saying it is gospel work that sustains us spiritually!

We are not supposed to be contending for the faith so as to just secure our place in the Church of England, we are to be commending the faith to a ripe harvest field where we are called to reap what has been sown by others. The big crisis for the Church is our ineffectiveness at working for the harvest that Jesus gave his life for. That is why we speak up on the PLF issue – because having a church conform to current cultural norms is a disaster to mission. Every province or denomination where that strategy has been adopted, has only then declined. When the fields are ripe for harvest, we shouldn't be debating about whether or not change our crops for the future, when there's much to bring home!

I have had the joy of confirming a couple of dozen people in recent months and ordaining a dozen others – it has been a wonderful privilege to hear many testimonies of God's grace and anticipate much future fruit. But it has not been a revival. Post-Covid and pressured by PLF, our numbers are down, our volunteers are more tired and fewer, our energy is sapped, and our fears for the future have grown. What will re-energise us? Jesus' food! "My food is to do the will of Him who sent me and to finish his work!" (v.34) To prioritise evangelism and to persevere in serving God's people.

The most powerful answer to the angst of the PLF is to be the recipients God's grace and blessing by the fruit He gives to us faithfully sharing the gospel. That has only ever started with us on our knees in prayer, and continued in engaging actively outside of the church family with the 98% who are lost without Christ in our communities. Let's be much better at mobilising our churches for evangelism, than we may have been mobilising them for PLF! Without the former, the latter is pointless!

But in addition, Jesus reminds us that we need to persevere in this work, not give up, because we may only be one small part of His wider purpose bringing a person to life (v.37-38). If we give up or get diverted, we may frustrate God's wider purpose that is intended to feed us spiritually and eternally.

So what is Jesus' solution for our presenting crisis? Major on the majors! Do the work of evangelism, persevere in it, and you will be fed spiritually by its fruit! Let's make sure that our complementarian churches are known as being fruitful, even amidst the fraught times – fed by Christ to share Him!



The General Synod in February approved the House of Bishops proposal to permit 'Prayers of Love and Faith', which include blessings, to be used in the context of couples who are in samesex civil unions, with the caveat that this should not be indicative of a change in the Doctrine of Marriage – which has thus far only ever included the understanding that the proper place for sexual intimacy is hetero-sexual marriage.

Three groups were then set up to: revise the proposed prayers, provide pastoral guidance as to their use (including updating the current guidance from 'Issues in Human Sexuality 1991), and explore appropriate 'pastoral reassurance' for the conscience of those objecting to their implementation. These groups have recently been disbanded unexpectedly, with their work not complete, although indications are that a newly constituted combined group will continue this work.

The General Synod in York is expected to only receive a report on progress, ahead of more substantive proposals in November (an extra Synod meeting put on specially). In the meantime, there have a been a number of serious challenges to the original proposals, including to their legal framework, from the CEEC and an Alliance of wider Networks, including HTB, New Wine, Forward in Faith, Catholic Group, UK Global Majority group, ReNew, Living Out and Myriad.

As I have written before, now is a time to Pray together, Stand together and Act together, as we seek to uphold the clear biblical teaching on marriage and sexual intimacy. I commend the CEEC website, www.ceec.info as a helpful resource for information and expressing that unity which is necessary in upholding biblical faithfulness.

HELPFUL RESOURCES-A BOOK REVIEW

Embracing Complementarianism

G Beynon & J Tooher (Good Book Company)

It is not enough to say that the Bible teaches that men should lead in the home and in the church family. This admirable book is a great guide to what else needs to be said (and practised).

Yes – it reminds us that men and women are equal but different and it looks carefully at the key biblical texts surrounding this issue, but it says a lot more. It speaks of godliness being expressed through our gender.

The real strength of the book is that it is reluctant to give a list of Do's and Don'ts. It speaks about key convictions based on Scripture shaping our practice of complementarian ministry.

It recognises the importance of a particular church context and culture in working these out in our circumstances. The appendices on specific issues such as preaching, 'grey areas' and women on staff teams are very helpful.

Every church that has passed an Ebbsfleet resolution ought to work through the areas this book addresses. And, as the authors urge, the conclusions the church leadership arrives at about their complementarian practice needs to be carefully communicated to the entire congregation.

There is a debree of flexibility to suit the successful candidate, and it might particularly suit a part-time incumbent or ordained woman deacon.
